NEW YORK STATE 3-8 ASSESSMENTS

What Parents Need to Know

New York State Education has recognized and addressed the questions of teachers and parents concerning the 3-8 Assessments. Below are examples of the significant changes that have been made for this year's testing.

Students will be allowed to continue working as long as they need during the regular school day

NYSED Assessments will have fewer questions to reduce possible student testing fatigue

Assessments have been written and reviewed by NYS educators to match classroom learning Student performance on the assessments will have NO APPR-related consequences

NYSED will release 75
percent of the test
questions before
the end of the
school year

Lake Shore has transitioned to computer-based testing for the 3-8 assessments in 2018

3-8 testing will move to a two-day testing schedule rather than a three-day schedule in 2018 Parents will have clearer score reports with more information about what students need and don't need to know

Highland Writers To Be Published

Pifth-grade students at Highland Elementary participated in the Young Writers' Crazy Creature Contest. ake Shore Middle Shore is proud to hold its first Battle of the Books! A book reveal party was organized by school librarian, Ms. Waterman, after school on January 23rd where students and teachers learned what the battle is all about. A book battle is where students form into teams of 3-5 and are responsible for reading five different books and must know the details of the books to score enough points to move on to the ultimate battle and get the chance to win the Battle of the Books Champion cup.

Fifty students have formed twelve teams and there are two teams of teachers.
