Step One: Find materials that interest you!

Step Two: Read, read, read up a storm!

Try to set aside some time each day, (right when you wake up in the morning might be a great time!) for free reading time. Get yourself comfortable, and try to limit distractions. If you are using audio, use headphones to help block out outside noises.

Step Three: Record your thoughts on what you've read!
