# **MISSION STATEMENT**

Music is a natural form of expression in the development of children and should be an integral part of the school curriculum from preschool through high school. The music program has aesthetic, creative, cultural, and academic values that complete and further the educational and social values of a quality education. The school is responsible for helping all children understand and enjoy music. It should assist in discovering and nurturing musical talent. Every child should have the opportunity to develop their potentiality for musical expression through exploration, experimentation, exposure, and enrichment.

The study and playing of a musical instrument and vocal training, whether alone or in a group, offers the young person a lifelong enjoyment and appreciation of music. This might be attained through creating, performing, or eventually, just as an educated listener. The pursuance of music, one of the Fine Arts, leads to deeper understanding and love for the other Fine Arts. This ability to value the aesthetic to a higher degree raises the joy of living and offers the person a foundation to become happy, well-adjusted, and useful cooperative citizen.

#### The goals of this music program are as follows:

- 1. To develop in the student an understanding and appreciation of the various types, styles, and forms of music which can be beneficial during an entire lifetime.
- 2. To develop better citizenship. Music participation emphasizes the ability to work with others as a member of a team. It teaches the importance of a cooperative effort, acceptance of leadership, and the need for self-discipline and responsibility.
- 3. To make students aware of the possibilities music offers as a career or vocation.
- 4. To contribute to and help broaden the cultural life of our community.
- 5. To help achieve self-realization through participation in the music program. Some results should be aesthetic experience, emotional development, creative attitudes, skill and knowledge, physical and mental health, mental stimulation, leisure time activity, self-expression, spiritual development, and personality development.
- 6. Our performing groups should strive to perform at the highest artistic level consistent with the experience and maturity of the group. The needs of individuals must not be sacrificed to this end.



# ATTENDANCE & PARTICIPATION + EFFORT + ETIQUETTE + PREPAREDNESS of MUSICAL ELEMENTS + INSTRUMENT HOME = QUARTERLY AVERAGE

The key to any music class is attendance and participation. Since most of the progress toward performances is made during rehearsal, aside from practice and preparation at home, the majority of this grade is hinged upon quality, results oriented participation in class. If a student isn't in attendance, excused or unexcused, they can't participate, affecting their overall growth toward our final performance. The rehearsal portion of the grade is calculated as follows on a daily basis (out of 100 points for the week);

#### • Attendance and Participation – 20 pts/day, 5 day school week

25 pts/day, 4 day school week

33 pt/days, 3 day school week

50 pts/day, 2 day school week

You will receive full credit each day for attending, appearing on time, participating, and making a positive contribution to class. Absence, tardiness, or failure to participate (forgetting your instrument) will result in a loss of some or all of this credit for the day. Students with an Excused absence can make up the points by staying after 10<sup>th</sup> period. Students must also be prepared with a pencil, music, and an instrument for rehearsals.

MSSED REHEARSALS, for any reason (excused or unexcused), MUST BE MADE-UP! To make-up a missed rehearsal, students should spend a study hall period or 10<sup>th</sup> period in the band room/practice rooms practicing their band music. At the end of the period, log the practice session on the chart next to the band office; STUDENTS MUST OBTAIN A TEACHER'S SIGNATURE!

# The following factors are considered in the Attendance and Participation part of the Rehearsal Grade: Effort -

Students are expected to put forth a positive and productive effort during any and all rehearsals.

#### Rehearsal Etiquette -

Students are expected to stay on task during rehearsals positively participating toward the day's goals without disrupting or negatively affecting the rehearsal with their behavior.

#### **Preparedness of Musical Elements**

The following **MUSICAL ELEMENTS** must be accurately achieved at every rehearsal and performance:

- 1. Note and Rhythm Accuracy
- 2. Tone

- 3. Intonation
- 4. Blend/Balance

5. Articulation

6. Instrument Facility and Technique

7. Phrasing

8. Breath Support

9. Ensemble Awareness (Entrances, Releases, Cut-offs, Dynamics)

10. Knowledge of Musical Material and Subject Matter

11. Scales and Warm-up

All required rehearsal assignments must be prepared prior to the next rehearsal. There may be work assigned aside from the usual practice subject matter. The completion of this material is required for the following rehearsal.

#### **Instrument Home**

Instrument cabinets will be checked randomly throughout the school year. It is an expectation that a student takes their instrument home every weekend and for major performances. Please discuss any problems with your director.

Concerts and performances are the culmination of our learning goals and are required events. Unexcused absences will affect your grade negatively.

⇒ **EXCUSED ABSENCE** - The only absences that are excused include severe illness or a family emergency. There will be no grading penalty. A phone call or written notification must be provided to the teacher as

soon as the student returns to school.

⇒ <u>UNEXCUSED ABSENCE</u> - Absences from a performing event for any other reason. Our calendar is set for the year and you have plenty of notice and time to plan. There are no school related sporting events scheduled opposite our concerts. If you are employed, it is your responsibility to notify your employer and make arrangements to attend the performance. **AN UNEXCUSED ABSENCE RESULTS AS AN** *AUTOMATIC FAILURE FOR THE QUARTER!* 

Students must contribute musically and intellectually to achieve success. **The success of the ensemble is greatly dependent upon your effort!** At this level of development, student ability levels may vary. 100% effort does not mean that only the best players will be rewarded with honorable grades. **The highest efforts will be rewarded.** 

Students must **ENJOY THEMSELVES DURING THEIR MUSICAL JOURNEY!** 

## SECTIONAL ATTENDANCE

#### **5% of Total Grade**

Students are required to attend sectional rehearsals each 10 week marking period. The times will be organized by your section leader, and you will work as a section on music for your next major performance. Your section leader will be instructed to hold more than 2 in case one or more of the dates conflict with your schedule. However, it is your responsibility to attend <u>AT LEAST 2</u>. Sectionals MUST BE completed prior to the major performance of each marking period. Section Leaders are expected to generate a sectional rehearsal form including attendance and goals to be handed in at the end of each marking period.



#### THE LESSON GRADE

#### 30% of Total Grade

7 - 10 LESSONS PER QUARTER

The following items are essential for your growth as an individual performer. Students will be responsible for the preparation of all subject matter covered and assigned at each lesson. Each lesson's grade will include the following major categories:

#### MUSICAL ELEMENTS

- 1. Scales (Major, Minor, and Chromatic)
  - 2. Technique/Facility (How well the student demonstrates correct fingerings and technique)
- 3. Posture
- 4. Book and Packet Work
- 5. Etudes/Small Group Ensemble Material
  - Note and Rhythm Accuracy, Tone, Intonation, Blend/Balance, Articulation, Phrasing, Breath Support, Exhibited Knowledge of: Musical Material and Subject Matter
    - **6. Preparation and Practice** (has the students practiced and prepared for the week?)

Each lesson grade is given out of 100pts in 5 point increments based upon the student's level of preparedness.

A LESSON GRADE OF; 90, 95, 100 = Student is obviously prepared and has practiced the material for their lesson. Student has a pencil and other necessary materials.

**80, 85** = Student has minimally prepared but is working to the best of their ability staying focused with progress during their lesson. Student has a pencil and other necessary materials.

**70, 75** = Student has not prepared at all for their lesson, is working to the best of their ability to learn the material, and has difficulty focusing. Student has a pencil and other necessary materials.

**60, 65** = Student has not prepared at all for their lesson, is working minimally to learn the material, and has difficulty focusing. Student has a pencil and other necessary materials.

**50, 55** = Student attends lesson, has not practiced, is not working, and has no lesson materials.

<u>LESSON ATTENDANCE</u>: Students must attend every lesson unless your academic teacher requires you to stay for a test, lab, or guest presenter. **IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to alert your lesson instructor prior to missing the lesson; then and only then will you be allowed to make up the missed lesson.** Missed lessons must be made up within 2 weeks during make-up times. Missed lessons will receive the grade of zero. Once a lesson has been made up, the zero will be excused. The remainder of the lessons for the quarter will then be weighted more heavily. If a lesson is not made-up the student will receive a zero for the lesson. It is to the student's advantage to attend the regularly scheduled lesson times.

Lesson Make ups should be arranged with Mr. Kresse or Mr. Blodgett during 10<sup>th</sup> period. At the conclusion of the make-up that day, the student needs to record their make-up session on the make-up chart next to the band room office; **INCLUDING THEIR TEACHER'S SIGNATURE!!** 

#### **SMART MUSIC**

#### 5% of Total Grade

Assigned scales, technique, and band music per quarter

Each quarter, students will be assigned a set of assignments through the Smart Music System. This system is an online program that makes practicing more relevant to a real music situation. Students can complete the assignments in school, or, a year's subscription can be purchased for home.

## THE QUARTERLY and FINAL PLAYING EXAMS

#### 10% of Quarterly/Final Average and JANUARY SOLO (required for Symphonic Band only)

- 1 to 2 weeks prior to the concert or end of each quarter you will be required to take a quarterly playing exam. This exam may include excerpts from your current band music or a prepared etude. This exam will assess your knowledge of the music as a gauge for your preparedness for the concert.
- The final playing exam will take place during a 15 min. time slot that you are responsible to sign up for. This exam will include scales, a prepared solo, and sight reading. This exam will also determine your placement for next year's bands. Missing your final playing exam will result in a zero, and no further consideration will be given for placement in the Symphonic Band.
- <u>SYMPHONIC BAND SOLO REQUIREMENT</u>. All Symphonic Band members are required to play a solo in January. Students will have the option of either playing their solo for the ECMEA All-County solo festival or for Mr. Blodgett and Mr. Kresse. The grade you receive at the festival or from Mr. Blodgett and Mr. Kresse will count as 10% of your final average and 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter average. Symphonic Band members are also encouraged, though not required, to play a solo at the spring NYSSMA solo festival as well (extra credit is available). Solo fees will be provided for the January Solo Festival. Transportation will be provided for the Spring NYSSMA Festival, but the solo fees must be paid by the student.

Plus 2 - For an A or OUTSTANDING rating earned on a LEVEL V or VI solo at the ECMEA Solo

Plus 1 - For an A or OUTSTANDING rating earned on a LEVEL IV solo at the ECMEA Solo

Festival or NYSSMA

**Plus 2** - For participation in the Memorial Day Events (on Memorial Day)

Plus 1 - For the participation and attendance of PEP BAND Activities (Per Event/Rehearsal

Attended)

**Plus 1** - For attendance at any concert or musical which you are not involved or performing. Also for advanced and professional groups i.e. Buffalo Philharmonic, an event at Sheas, university, etc.

**Plus .5** - For every 30 minutes spent practicing voluntarily in the band room before, during, or after school. Students will only receive credit for time logged on form and teacher signature.

#### WEEKLY LESSON AND BAND INFORMATION

- 1. Punctual Attendance (Be there on time!) is the first step toward having a good lesson or band rehearsal. <u>Symphonic Band downbeat is 7:58 arrive BY THE BELL</u>, <u>Concert Band is 8:42 arrive BY THE BELL</u>. That means in your chair with your instruments assembled, music out, mouths closed, ready to play! <u>NO EXCEPTIONS!</u> Since our rehearsals are 40 min., with setup and time needed to put away your instruments, the true rehearsal time may only be 30-35min. We will see each other every day, but time management will be a necessity for all of us! Please understand the importance of starting on time. A reminder that Backpacks are to remain in your school locker. Cell Phones and Headphones are NOT permitted in rehearsal.
- 2. **Remember your materials!** Materials include your instrument, music, and any other playing accessories, along with your Band Notebook. Each of you will be assigned a concert folder. The folders are to be kept in the storage cabinet and are to be used each rehearsal and taken home on weekends! **Each student is required to use their own folder.**

Woodwind players, please have quality reeds at all times!

Brass players, please have all valves and slides oiled and greased!

- 3. Always have **Two Pencils!** Marking helpful comments in your music is an important part of being a good performer. We will also be working on other activities during rehearsals.
- 4. **Be Prepared!** You have to prepare at home! It is impossible to prepare for multiple concerts along with all of the other events we play, and get ready for a Spring adjudication with school preparation only.
- 5. <u>STOP PLAYING WHEN CUT OFF!</u> Don't waste valuable time "doodling" during rehearsal. When you are cut off, it is because we need to fix something. We will not be patient with this lack of respect for your teachers, your colleagues, or the music!!!!!!
- 6. Inform your director <u>prior</u> to your scheduled lesson of any conflict. Remember, the progress of each group, especially groups that play ensemble literature, depends upon <u>attendance of all members</u>. Students must fill out time they made up on the missed lesson/rehearsal chart next to the band office. Once student has completed time ask Mr. Blodgett or Mr.

Kresse for a signature ensuring you will receive credit.

- 7. Students are **responsible for work assigned at every lesson and rehearsal** whether they were in attendance or not. Obtain your assignments from us any time during the day, try a friend, or have your parents give us a call at school.
- 8. Students are expected to **spend time outside of rehearsals and lessons preparing assignments.** We guarantee that if you practice, you will make great progress individually and as a group.
- 9. Students are financially responsible for school owned instruments. Normal wear is covered, however, any damage charges must be repaid at the **student's expense. Loan agreements must be on record to be given an instrument.**
- 10. No one is to play an instrument other than the one that is assigned to them. Percussion instruments and pianos are to be played by percussionists or by students who have the director's permission.
- 11. All instruments are to be put away in your cases, neatly following any lesson, rehearsal, or performance. Chronic disrespect to your issued instrument/s or assigned instrument cabinet will negatively affect your average.
- 12. The room is to be kept neat and should be placed back to its original setup if anything is moved or displaced. Percussion MUST keep their area neat and clean. Large percussion instruments should be covered following each rehearsal. Small percussion instruments should be put away following each rehearsal.
- 13. Food and/or drink will be allowed in the room, UNLESS you can't clean up after yourselves, then this privilege will be revoked immediately.
- 14. The instrument closet doors are to be shut after you use them. Simply close the doors DO NOT LEAVE THEM OPEN continually. Each closet should be kept neat and clean. *THEY ARE NOT YOUR PERSONAL STORAGE SPACES!!!*
- 15. Folder slots are to be used for storing folders and music only, do not keep your folders in your instrument cabinet, nor should you leave your mouthpiece in your folder, that's how they break!
- 16. **STUDENTS SPENDING A STUDY HALL IN THE BAND ROOM:** "Sitting at the band room table" is a privilege. Lessons and other educational activities take place all day. You first must have prior approval from Mr. Kresse or Mr. Blodgett AND your study hall teacher. You then need to be doing one of the following; 1. Practicing or 2. Studying quietly. THE BAND TABLE IS NOT A HANG OUT! **Failure to comply or to keep the area clean will revoke your privileges.**

#### FIRE EVACUATION PROCEDURES



In the unlikely event of a fire;

- 1. Leave your instruments on your chairs.
- 2. Take any immediately accessible valuable items. i.e. Purse, Jacket
- 3. Turn off all lights and make sure the doors close behind you.
- 4. Exit the band room out the door by the drink machines/across from the pool.
- 5. Proceed quickly and quietly out the rear doors toward the football field.
- 6. Move away from the building and head all the way to the Soccer

field.

7. Wait for the loudspeaker announcement allowing us to reenter the building.

#### **EMERGENCY LOCKDOWN PROCEDURES**

In the unlikely event of a lockdown;

- 1. Immediate Room Silence
- 2. Lock all doors and windows barricade if necessary. Use file cabinets/tables/piano.
- 3. Move into the band office, practice rooms, or proceed to the farthest corner of the room out of sight from the main doors.
- 4. REMAIN ABSOLUTELY SILENT and stay out of sight until we are released by a School Official or Police Officer!
  - 5. If you have no other choice but to exit, the back doors to the courtyard are an option. Then proceed to the doors to the left and exit the building.



#### SCHEDULING AND LESSON SCHEDULES

Your lesson schedule will be provided to you in September for the year. Each student will be assigned a group number or letter. You will have one lesson per week taking place for one full period.

Your classroom teachers will require advance notice for your lesson times. Please be considerate and inform them one class in advance. (at least one day prior is responsible, not the day of)

#### PERFORMING EVENT EXPECTATIONS

- 1. ATTENDANCE AT ALL CONCERTS AND PERFORMING EVENTS IS MANDATORY. IF YOU MISS A PERFORMANCE, YOU WILL FAIL THE QUARTER!
- 2. Students are expected to report on time, prepared, dressed appropriately, and remain quiet to await further instructions.
- 3. Students are expected to maintain the <u>highest musical standards</u> as a member of the Lake Shore High School Bands and the <u>highest standard of behavior</u> as a member of the Lake Shore High School.
- 4. All monitors and substitutes, whether teachers, aids, or parents, are to be strictly respected. **No student is ever to confront a chaperone!** Any problem is to be handled by the director and **never the student.**
- 5. In "Extra Curricular" Performing Events: **Only students exhibiting favorable classroom grades and behavior will be permitted to participate.** There will be a number of performing events aside from our regularly scheduled concert programs. You are representing all of your hard work and dedication, let's do it in a professional manner.

#### **PATRONS**

#### SECTION LEADERS AND SECTIONAL REHEARSALS

To continue a great effort toward a student ownership approach to the program, each section of each band will be assigned a SECTION LEADER, based upon their leadership abilities and dedication to the program. These student liaisons to the director will be given specific responsibilities to help assure that we as a band are achieving our utmost potential in organization, behavior, and musical progress.

<u>Each Section Leader MUST hold multiple sectionals, but you are required to attend 2 sectional rehearsals per quarter.</u> The Section Leader is responsible for generating a formal attendance and progress sheet each quarter to be submitted as a formal assignment at the end of each marking period.

Each band member will be required to respect their section leader and their requests. If a section is not working together, your grades will be affected negatively.

#### SENIOR HIGH BAND ALIGNMENT

#### SYMPHONIC BAND and CONCERT BAND

In an effort to assure that all of our instrumental music students receive the best music education, play music that is appropriate for their ability level, have greater scheduling flexibility, a balanced instrumentation, there will be two Senior High Bands; the Symphonic Band and Concert Band. The Symphonic Band will be an audition group encompassing students in grade 9 - 12 who are playing at a Level of IV-VI and can meet a stringent set of audition requirements. The Concert Band will encompass students in grades 9 - 12 who are playing at any level.

Nearly all high schools with quality music programs throughout Western New York and the Country exist in a schedule set up exactly like this, utilizing multiple bands. This really is best for ALL of the students. When students are playing music that is level appropriate, their learning and growth factor musically is much greater. All of the students become BETTER PLAYERS and sometimes can assume leadership roles that may never have been possible. Both groups will share all of the same school, musical, trip, concert, and exciting experiences.

It is important, as a member of the HS Bands, that we dress uniformly for success! Therefore, the directors will strictly enforce the CORRECT CONCERT ATTIRE. If there is an unavoidable problem, please contact us immediately and we will try to make other arrangements.

Otherwise, if you show up to a performing event dressed inappropriately, you will be asked to change and may be asked not to perform - it may negatively affect your Quarterly Average!

There has been a problem in the past few years with our ladies trying to "outstyle" one another. We have extra dresses on hand and will make you wear one if you choose not to be prepared with the correct attire.

The next few pages are great resources for your concert attire purchase. Gentlemen, <u>YOU MUST</u> order your ties from through the school to assure uniformity in style and color. Ladies, <u>YOU MUST</u> also order your dresses through the school, from the choices provided.

#### BAND WIND BREAKERS AND FLIP FOLDERS

At the beginning of the year, you will be assigned a Windbreaker Jacket along with a flip folder. These items are property of the school and the wear, care, and placement are **YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.** You can wear and use the jacket for any band related school function including Parades, non-formal performances, and trips. The jacket is not to be used as an "everyday" item. It is essentially a uniform and should only be used appropriately.

When assigned your band windbreaker, the jacket will have a number, you will sign a card acknowledging that you are aware of the number and agree to return the same jacket of the same number. Sometimes students mistakenly "exchange" jackets with another student since they look identical. However, when it's time to turn in the jacket, the other student doesn't turn yours in, making it look like you have misplaced it.

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE NUMBERED JACKET ASSIGNED TO YOU FOR THE ENTIRE YEAR - PERIOD!!!!! There is no further discussion on the matter.

If you lose or misplace your jacket, you will be held responsible to pay the school for its value - \$40.00. The same procedure applies to your flip folders during the year. **YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE NUMBERED FLIP FOLDER ASSIGNED TO YOU FOR FALL AND SPRING PERIOD!!!!** There is no further discussion on the matter. If you lose or misplace your flip folders, you will be held responsible to pay the school for it's value - \$15.00/ flip folder
