THE SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Lake Shore Central School District (Evans-Brant) is located along the southern shore of Lake Erie, approximately 21 miles south of the City of Buffalo. It is both suburban and rural in nature and serves the Towns of Brant, Evans, parts of Eden, North Collins, and the Villages of Angola and Farnham.

The District has a long tradition of providing exceptional education opportunities for its students. They ensure all pupils acquire the skills and knowledge that will prepare them for college and careers.

There are six buildings in the District: A.J. Schmidt Elementary, Highland Elementary, J.T. Waugh Elementary, Lake Shore Middle School, Lake Shore Senior High School, and the W.T. Hoag Educational Center. Parent Teacher Groups exist in each of the elementary buildings and middle school and have a strong, positive relationship with the District.

The District is currently undergoing an extensive \$58 million Capital Construction Project that will bolster science, technology, music, art, athletics, and outdoor facilities also utilized by the community.

The District can house an additional 500 students with no changes to the existing infrastructure and the budget is consistently kept within the tax cap.

THE INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM



At the elementary schools, Highland, A.J. Schmidt, and J.T. Waugh, the District provides full day kindergarten. The W.T. Hoag Educational Center is home to Universal Pre-K classes. Each school provides a caring, child-centered environment, which fosters academic success. Emphasis is placed on critical thinking and problem-solving skills. Academic Intervention programs in ELA and Math are offered as well as programs for special education.

The Lake Shore Middle School (grades 6-8) provides an ideal setting for delivering educational services to a unique age group of learners. Emphasis is placed on the development of the whole child, including academics as well as social/emotional growth.

A major component of the Middle School is the concept of "Team Teaching" in which each child is a member of an academic team. Each team works to develop our students to have greater responsibility and independence as academic learners. Remediation programs are also available to assist the students in their academic achievement.

The Senior High School offers a wide range of academic programs. Regents, Honors, and Advanced Placement courses are offered, as well as extra curricular activities, technology, music, art, and other elective programs allowing students to develop all facets of skills and interests. Seven Career and Technical Education courses are available at the Willis H. Carrier Educational Center located directly next to the Senior High building. Students can choose from Cosmetology, Criminal Justice, Culinary Arts/Hospitality Management, Heating, Air Conditioning & Refrigeration, Information Technology/Computer Systems, and Small Animal Science.

An additional six courses are offered at the Phillip J.
LoGuidice Educational Center in Fredonia, NY:
Automotive Body Repair, Automotive Technology,
Conservation/Heavy Equipment Operation,
Construction Technology, Health Services, and
Welding/Metal Fabrication.

Lake Shore Central Schools also offer one of the most comprehensive technology systems in the state. The District has over 2,500 computers, iPads, and Chromebooks available for classroom use with Internet access.



EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Other significant aspects of the District include a comprehensive interscholastic athletic program, which serves all secondary students grades seven through twelve along with intramural programs at a club level.

Additionally, the District boasts award-winning music and art programs in grades K-12. Bands exist at the Elementary, Middle, and Senior High school levels comprised of orchestras, wind ensembles, jazz bands, and choral programs. Instrumental instruction starts in grade 4.


Musicals are very popular on all campuses and are well attended by the community.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

In an effort to provide continuing education and life-long learning, Lake Shore offers a comprehensive community education program, providing approximately 150 opportunities throughout the year. It also operates a fully equipped fitness center open to the public for a nominal fee.

Programs include art and wellness classes, athletic sessions, and a wide variety of bus tours to local, regional, and New York State attractions.
