





Family Rights & Legal Notices

Family Rights and Privacy Act

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

- The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the Lake Shore Central School District ("the District") receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the building principal a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The District official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected;
- 2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA. Parents or eligible students who wish to ask the District to amend a record should write the building principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it should be changed. If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing;
- 3) The right to provide written consent before the school discloses personally identifiable information ("PII") contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A "school official" is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor (including substitutes), or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel): a person serving on the District's Board: a volunteer or contractor outside of the school who performs an institutional service or function for which the District would otherwise use its own employees and who is under the direct control of the District with respect to the use and maintenance of PII from education records, such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist; a parent or student volunteering to serve on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee; or a parent, student, or other volunteer assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. Upon request, the District discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll, or is already enrolled if the disclosure is for purposes related to the student's enrollment or transfer;
- 4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is: Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 400 Maryland Avenue, SW, Washington, DC 20202-5920.

Release of Directory Information

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") requires that the District, with certain exceptions, obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's education records. However, the District may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised the District to the contrary in accordance with District procedures. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow the District to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school publications. Examples include, but are not limited to: (i) a playbill, showing your student's role in a drama production; (ii) the annual yearbook; (iii) honor roll or other recognition lists; (iv) graduation programs; and (v) sports activity sheets, such as for wrestling, showing weight and height of team members.

Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks. In addition, two federal laws require local educational agencies (LEAs) receiving assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) to provide military recruiters, upon request, with the following information - names, addresses and telephone listings - unless parents have advised the LEA that they do not want their student's information disclosed without their prior written consent. If you do not want the District to disclose directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the Superintendent of Schools or building principal in writing by September 30, 2020. The District has designated the following information as directory information: (i) student's name; (ii) photograph (iii) grade level (iv) participation in officially recognized activities and sports; (v) achievements, awards and honors; and (vi) weight and height of members of athletic teams.

Title IX Public Notice (Sex Discrimination)

In compliance with Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972, the District does not discriminate on the basis of sex in its educational programs or activities including admissions and employment. No student will be excluded on such basis from participating in or having access to the District's educational program, including, but not limited to, any course offerings, student athletics, counseling services, extracurricular activities, or other school resources. Inquiries about Title IX may be referred to the District's Title IX Coordinators, to the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights of the U.S. Department of Education, or both.

Section 504 Public Notice (Disability)

In compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the District does not discriminate on the basis of disability. No qualified student with a disability shall, on the basis of that disability, be denied access to any of the District's educational programs or activities. The District's designated compliance officers who coordinate the nondiscrimination requirements of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 are Daniel Pacos, Assistant Superintendent for Administration & Finance, 926-2221; or Paula Eastman, J. T. Waugh Elementary Principal, 926-2305.

Students with Disabilities - Child Find

Pursuant to the Federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act ("IDEA") and Article 89 of the New York State Education Law, the District seeks to locate, identify, evaluate, and maintain information about all children with disabilities residing within the District, including those attending private schools. Parents or legal guardians who believe their child has a handicapping condition and may be in need of special services should contact the Director of Pupil Personnel Services at 926-2230.

Equal Opportunity

The District, its officers and employees shall not discriminate against any student, employee or applicant on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, religion, sex (including gender identity or the status of being transgender), sexual orientation, disability, age, political affiliation, military status, marital status, pregnancy-related condition, predisposing genetic characteristics, domestic-violence-victim status, criminal arrest or conviction record, or any other basis protected by non-discrimination laws. It is the policy of the Board of Education to comply with the requirements listed in Title IX of the 1972 Educational Amendments and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. Any member of the District's staff or any pupil or parent should address questions and complaints regarding discrimination to the District Compliance Officers at 959 Beach Road, Angola, NY 14006: Daniel Pacos, Assistant Superintendent of Administration & Finance, 926-2221; and Paula Eastman, J. Sexual Harassment

The District recognizes the responsibility to provide an environment for students and staff that is free of sexual harassment and intimidation. The District policies on sexual harassment are available upon request to all employees and students. A District-wide effort to explain to students what sexual harassment is and what behavior is unacceptable has been integrated into the curriculum in accordance with our character education curriculum.

Information Regarding Teacher Qualifications

In accordance with federal law, parents have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teachers. Specifically, they have the right to request the following information concerning the child's teachers: (i) whether the teacher has met New York State qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas he or she teachers; (ii) whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status under which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived; (iii) the teacher's college major; (iv) whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of those degrees; and (v) if your child receives services from any instructional assistants or similar paraprofessionals, the qualifications for those individuals.

In accordance with New York Education Law, parents and legal guardians may request the final quality rating and composite effectiveness score for each of the teachers and for the principal of the school building to which their student is assigned for the current school year. The District will also provide parents and legal guardians with an oral or written explanation of the composite effectiveness scoring ranges for final quality ratings, and an opportunity to understand such scores in the context of teacher evaluation and student performance.

Code of Conduct (Summary)

Purpose

- The Lake Shore Central School District Code of Conduct is intended to:
- encourage appropriate behavior;
- provide a school environment free of harassment, bullying, and discrimination as per the Dignity For All Students Act;
- ensure the safety and security of all members of the school community; and
- promote a safe and effective learning environment.

The Code governs the conduct of students, school personnel, parents, and other visitors while on school property or attending school functions. It includes the range of penalties that may be imposed for code violations and defines the roles of essential partners (teachers, administrators, other school personnel, the board of education and parents) in maintaining safe, orderly schools.

Student Dress Code

All students are expected to give proper attention to personal cleanliness and to dress appropriately for school and school functions. Students who violate the student dress code shall be required to modify their appearance by covering or removing the offending item and, if necessary or practical, replacing it with an acceptable item. Any student who refuses to do so, or who repeatedly violates the dress code, may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including out-of-school suspension.

Prohibited Student Conduct

Behavior that is disorderly, insubordinate, disruptive, violent, or endangers others is prohibited. Academic misconduct, which is also prohibited, includes plagiarism, cheating, copying, altering records, accessing other users accounts, violating the District's Acceptable Use Policy or assisting other students in such actions.

Reporting Violations

All students are expected to report violations of the Code of Conduct to those in authority. District staff not authorized to impose disciplinary actions are expected to report violations to their supervisor. Any weapon, alcohol, or other illegal substance will be confiscated immediately. Code violations that constitute a crime will be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency.

Disciplinary Penalties and Procedures

Disciplinary action, when necessary, will be firm, fair, and consistent. As a general rule, discipline will be progressive. That is, a student's first offense will usually merit a lesser penalty than subsequent violations of the same disciplinary rule. The Code of Conduct contains levels of discipline ranging from verbal warning to permanent suspension from school. Regardless of the penalty imposed, the school personnel authorized to impose the penalty must inform the student of the alleged misconduct and must investigate, to the extent necessary, the facts surrounding the alleged misconduct. Students subject to more severe penalties have additional rights as set forth in the Code of Conduct.

Alternative Instruction

When a student is removed from class or suspended from school (if the student is of compulsory attendance age), the District will take immediate steps to provide alternative instruction for the student as soon as practicable, typically within one or two days after the start of the suspension.

Discipline of Students with Disabilities

While all students are subject to the same Code of Conduct, the Board of Education recognizes that students with disabilities are entitled to additional procedural protections. The Code of Conduct affords students with disabilities subject to disciplinary action no greater or lesser rights than those expressly afforded by applicable federal and state laws and regulations.

Corporal Punishment

Corporal punishment is defined as an act of physical force upon a student for the purpose of punishing that student. Corporal punishment is strictly forbidden; however, reasonable force may be used in the limited situations described in the Code of Conduct when alternative procedures and methods cannot reasonably be used.

Student Searches and Interrogations

School officials may guestion a student about an alleged violation of law or the District Code of Conduct. Students are not entitled to a "Miranda" type warning, nor are school officials obligated to contact a student's parents before questioning. School officials, however, will tell students why they are being questioned. In addition, the Board authorizes certain school officials to conduct searches of students and their belongings if there is reasonable suspicion that such a search will result in evidence that the student violated a law or the District Code of Conduct. Searches will be limited in scope based on the evidence sought and shall not be more intrusive than is warranted based on the nature and severity of the circumstances. The rules regarding searches of students and their belongings do not apply to student lockers, desks, and other school storage places. Students have no reasonable expectation of privacy with respect to areas considered school property. This means that student lockers, desks, and other school storage places may be subject to search at any time by school officials without prior notice to students and without their consent.

Visitors to the Schools

All visitors to a school must report to the office of the principal upon arrival and register. Visitors attending school functions that are open to the public, such as PTG/PTA meetings or public gatherings, are not required to register. Any unauthorized person on school property will be reported to the principal or designee. Unauthorized persons will be asked to leave. All visitors are expected to abide by the rules of public conduct on school property as contained in the Code of Conduct.

Public Conduct on School Property

All persons on school property or attending a school function, including athletic events, shall conduct themselves in a respectful and orderly manner. In addition, all persons on school property or attending a school function are expected to be properly attired for the purpose they are on school property. The District may prohibit any visitor who violates the rules of public conduct from being on school property or attending school functions. Use, distribution or the possession of tobacco products, e-cigarettes/vaporizers, alcohol or other illegal substances is prohibited on school property.


