Presentations to the Board of Education

Presentation by William G. Houston Middle School students Hunter Heater, Marlee Hill, and Brylee Jones:

- Three William G. Houston Middle School students presented about what the seal is an how they will earn one point of that seal for graduation.
- The seal indicates that the student understands commitment to participatory government, civic responsibility, and civic values; has completed two civic action projects or required courses, and recognizes the value of civic

engagement and scholarship. These students earn red, white and blue cords to be worn at graduation.

- Civic integration at the 6th grade level consists of vocabulary development and integration of civics into the curriculum. The 7th grade Government unit provides a deeper understanding of civics, voting, branches of government, the Constitution, and giving back to the community. The 8th grade integration will focus on civics application, specifically the implementation of a Civic Action Project/ Capstone Project that is integrated via social studies with the units of study.
- These 8th graders will earn one credit toward the SCR. They will address a real world need in society related to a specific civic issue, for example, the Operation Good Neighbor Sneaker Drive, and the Food Drive through Feed-More WNY.
