Information for Parent(s) / Guardian(s) on Alcohol-Based Hand Sanitizers

Dear Parent(s) / Guardian(s):

March 13, 2020

Hand washing guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that **hands** should be washed for 30 seconds with warm soapy water as the best way to clean hands and reduce illness. If soap and water are not available available, alcohol-based hand sanitizers (with at least 60% alcohol) are an effective alternative for cleaning hands.

Alcohol-based hand sanitizers are considered over-the-counter drugs by the US Food and Drug Administration. Lake Shore's physician is approving the use of ABHS in our schools as an **additional** resource for hand cleaning.

Hand sanitizers do not work for removing allergens. Handwashing with soap and warm water is needed. The use of sanitizer will be done under adult supervision. Staff will be trained when to report concerns to the school nurse.

Please share this information with your child:

- Washing for 30 seconds with warm soapy water as the best way to clean hands and reduce illness
- A dime-size amount of hand sanitizer is all that is needed
- Rub over the hands until the gel is dry
- Keep their hands off the face, eyes, nose, or mouth while hands are wet
- If they have cuts on their hands or feel stinging, they should not use the sanitizer and tell their teacher.

If you do not want your child to use ABHS, please send written notice to your child's school nurse.
