### Hello Everyone,

Last month, New York State's Public Health and Health Planning Council passed an emergency regulation, and the Health Commissioner issued a determination, requiring weekly COVID-19 testing for all unvaccinated school employees. Thus, weekly testing is now mandatory if the District has not received your documentation of full vaccination.

This is yet another chapter in the Age of Covid, and we appreciate your understanding and patience as we navigate these new requirements along with you. Here is the procedure for employees undergoing weekly testing:

#### Where to send results:

Electronic copies of your test results must be emailed to this address only: **COVID.info@lscsd.org.** Do not send the link from your test results—it cannot be opened on our end. Results must be in pdf format and include **your name**, **date of test** (collection date), and results of test.

#### The testing cycle:

Testing cycles start on Sundays and end on Saturdays. If you won't have the results by the Saturday deadline, you must provide confirmation of the date/time of your test (proof of appointment) and then send the results as soon as you receive them. Failure to submit test results will result in placement on unpaid leave pending vaccination or testing or, in the event of continued noncompliance, dismissal.

### How to arrange testing:

Employees can arrange testing with their primary care physician, all local pharmacies, or by calling 716-858-2929 to schedule a test through the ECDOH. For a list of testing locations, please see page 9 or click <a href="HERE">HERE</a>. Home test results are not acceptable, however we are looking into providing opportunities for employees to meet the testing requirements on campus. More information is forthcoming.

Again, we appreciate everyone's patience and cooperation as we follow the many requirements that allow us to maintain in-person instruction five days a week. Stay healthy, stay safe and stay Eagle strong!


Girls JV Volleyball team passed by,



Among the projects underway are the chairs that are auctioned every year during the High School musical (which is *The Wizard of Oz,* show dates Oct. 28-30, 7 pm).








## Tour Con't ...

The final stop on the tour was a look at the school's renovated gymnasium with its awesome floor design, new curtains, green paint and green bleachers.

That's Mr. Robert Pfohl (burgundy shirt), Class of '58, and his wife, Dr. Emily M. Pfohl (gray top; doctorate in linguistics and rhetoric; worked with the Batavia School for the Blind).

Mr. Pfohl, who attended School #6 in Evans (before the schools were centralized), was a freshman here in 1954, and in the first graduating class to go through all four high school years at the then new school.



He went on to become a rehab counselor, eventually serving as the District Office Manager for the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation in Queens, NY. He said he received a very good education at Lake Shore in the '50s, and the tour left him of the opinion that students still get a very good education here in 2021.

### **Practicing German—with Croatian Students!**

Students from Herr Fritz Schattauer's German 4 and German 5 classes had an exciting opportunity to get to know other students who also study German—but live in Croatia.

The Lake Shore students Zoomed with students from Frau Ljubica Savic's German class in Zagreb, Croatia. They asked each other questions in German, their common language, and tried to guess which country each class was from.

Typical questions were, "Ist dein Land gross?" (Is your country large?), "Sprichst du Russisch?" (Do you speak Russian?), or "Ist die Farbe rot in deiner Fahne?" (Is the color red in your flag?)

"Both classes did a great job using a different language," said Herr Schattauer, "but the Croatian students figured out we were Americans before we guessed Croatia.




"I was so proud of how seriously my students took this activity. They really tried hard to speak German well and, I believe, were generally disappointed that they did not guess the right country first. But when the Croatian students asked, 'Ist dein Land in Nord Amerika?,' (Is your country in North America), they figured it out easily."

Afterward, students asked each other questions to get to know each other better. Aiden M., a senior, said he found it, "cool to meet other students from another country, and a fun way to learn German." His classmate, Evan R., enjoyed it as well because, "The Croatian students were the same age, so I was comfortable speaking with them." Jill G. enjoyed how the students in her class and from Croatia, "got into it and I enjoyed the relaxed feeling."

Since real life conversations are the best way to practice a foreign language, students hope to do this again with other classes from around the world. Knowing German teachers from other countries, their teacher is already working hard to make that happen.

## 'Thank you, Tony ...'



Breast Cancer Awareness
Month launched with an Eagle
flourish when Sen. Sean Ryan
presented a NYS Senate
Commendation Award to High
School teacher Tony George,
the founder of Bald for Bucks,
during Homecoming events.

In 2002, when Mr. George's sister, Cathy, was undergoing chemotherapy, he shaved his own head in solidarity. When he told his students about it, they began collecting donations, eventually raising \$3,600.

Cathy passed in 2004, but the George family's tragic loss inspired a remarkable movement in Western New York. Since its inception, the annual Bald for Bucks campaign has raised more than \$6 million for cancer research and patient care at Roswell Park Comprehensive Cancer Center. More than half a million dollars of that amount was raised at Lake Shore Central, Sen. Ryan noted when presenting the award.
