THE GOOD NEWS!!!

- The NYS Education Department has listened to parents, teachers, administrators, etc. regarding problems with the assessments.
- Significant changes have been made:
 - Administering tests reduced to two days; no time limits when taking the tests.
 - Assessments will *not* be used to evaluate teachers or school buildings.
 - No financial penalties from NY State on schools with high opt-out rates.

WHY TAKE ASSESSMENTS: THEY FOCUS ON THE STUDENTS:

- They are one of many measures to analyze students' successes and needs for remediation if necessary.
- They are indicators that help determine effective programs that insure continued student success.
- They are indicators to help schools recognize the best trends in educational strategies for student success.
- They offer data in a timely fashion to help improve educational instruction.

WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT PARTICIPATION RATES:

- The Federal Government is still requiring school districts to raise assessment participation rates to 95%.
- Lake Shore's participation rates have grown steadily in recent years. We thank our parents and teachers for their diligence in supporting students taking these tests.
- Even with this growth, Lake Shore is still far below the target of 95% participation.
- A high participation rate helps the District to gather data to evaluate educational programing.
- We want enough data to show that LSC is very successful and one of the finest Districts in WNY.

MOVING FORWARD:

- Lake Shore fully realizes each parent's right to opt-out his/her child in taking the NYS Assessments.
- Parents may discuss their children's Assessment Scores by contacting their principals.
- Lake Shore sincerely asks that all students participate in the NY State Assessments.
