All 3-8 questions were written and reviewed by 22 NYS educators - some questions were replaced or updated for 2018

New York State 3-8 Assessments will not be timed and will have fewer questions The student report for Parents will feature easy-to-understand language in a new format

NYSED released 75 percent of the test questions before the end of the school year Lake Shore has transitioned to computer-based testing for the 3-8 assessments in 2018

3-8 testing will move to a two-day testing schedule rather than a three-day schedule in 2018 NYSED is committed to making further improvements going forward
