## Candidates' Night

A "Meet the Candidates Night," moderated by the Buffalo/Niagara League of Women Voters, was conducted Tuesday night. You can view the recording <u>HERE</u>.

The candidates who receive the highest number of votes at the Annual Meeting will fill the expired terms of the two incumbents and will serve on the Board of Education for three-year terms to commence on July 1, 2021 and expire June 30, 2024. ## **Public Hearing**

On the Proposed 2021-22 Budget

#### **Budget & 2 Propositions on the Ballot for May 18**

A Public Hearing was conducted Tuesday night on the proposed 2021-22 school budget and two no-tax-increase propositions.

The proposed \$60,665,973 budget carries an estimated \$23.58 tax levy increase on a \$100,000 home (before STAR savings) in the Town of Evans.

**No-Tax-Increase Proposition 2** is for the purchase of five buses and a pick-up truck. When new buses are purchased, State Aid is reimbursed to the District and old buses are auctioned off. With those funds cycling in, the result is no local cost to taxpayers.

**No-Tax-Increase Proposition 3** would establish a Capital Reserve Fund allowing the District to reduce its reliance on State Aid by moving money saved in its Debt Reserve Fund into a fund to pay for future needs. The Capital Reserve Fund would be funded through such savings.

Although there is no tax increase on Proposition 2 or 3, voter approval is needed to proceed. You can view the recording of the Budget Public Hearing HERE.

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# The Show Goes On! Lake Shore High School Prepares for Virtual Musical

The Lake Shore High School Art, Music and Theater Departments won't let the pandemic get in the way of this year's annual musical. The show WILL go on!

"This year, the school is presenting *Disney's Freaky Friday,* which really describes parts of our lives lately where things are the opposite of or not what they should be," says Producer Jeff Connors. With a cast and crew of around 60 students, the production is a wonderful collaboration, showcasing phenomenal musical, acting, dancing and artistic talents, he says.

As with most schools presenting a musical this school year, Lake Shore's production will be virtual. It will be available June 4-6th (Friday and Saturday at 7 p.m. and a Sunday matinee at 2 p.m.).

"The show actually is being filmed prior in May, then edited and then ready to go by June," says Mr. Connors. "Many changes and challenges have made this production one to remember. For one, our students are socially distanced and/or masked at all times. The cast normally rehearses with a live orchestra pit in front of the stage, but this year, the pit previously recorded all song tracks, and the cast is using those tracks to prepare for the official recording of the show in late May. Finally, our box office is also different this year. Patrons will purchase tickets online, paying by credit or debit card for a link that will be sent to their email. Consider this a pay-per view experience!"

"It has been a 'freaky' year, but working together, the cast and crew at Lake Shore will be certain to provide a wonderful musical experience with lots of fun," he promises.

# There's A New Book and it

## Features Lake Shore!

ISTE's (International Society for Technology in Education) latest book, <u>The Immersive Class-room: Create Customized Learning Experiences</u> with AR/VR, explores the use of immersive technologies (Augmented Reality, Virtual Reality, and Mixed Reality) in the classroom. So, where does Lake Shore fit in?

"The High School brought in Oculus Rift, a virtual reality system, to build on student creativity in an art class," says Technology Integrator Mike Drezek. "We shared our steps towards successful implementation and our emphasis on not needing to be an expert before attempting to create immersive technology opportunities for students."

The initiative took place last year in Megan Smaldino's New Media art elective. "We couldn't do the VR class this year because of COVID-19," she says, but last year's work was enough to grab ISTE's attention.

Mr. Drezek says author Jaime Donally deemed their efforts book-worthy because, "Not only were students sharing creations to inspire other artists and creators, they were leading the creation of screencasts (video tutorials) to help classmates improve their skills with immersive technology. As these immersive technologies are becoming more widely adopted in the workforce, getting a meaningful experience with it at Lake Shore is something the District wanted to prioritize." A team approach, among teachers, tech integrators, IT, and administration, helped make it all possible.



"It's not about politics, it's about governing and elections and to making sure they go off without a hitch," he said.


This is a class that is committed to voting, says Mrs. Chimera. All of the students are registered to vote.

## Reminders!

#### **Keeping Us Safe & Our Buildings Open**







Although the positivity rate is dropping, to keep our buildings open and staff, students and colleagues safe from COVID-19, we must continue to follow all protocols:

- Masks should be worn at all times.
- Social Distancing for 6 feet or more at all times. (The ECDOH considers someone a "close contact" if they are less than 6 feet for 10 consecutive minutes or more.)
- Frequently wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and running water are not immediately available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer and rub hands together until they are dry.
- Stay home if sick.
- Faculty & Staff should take breaks in separate locations to help minimize the spread of any potential COVID-19 that may affect your building.
- Avoid gatherings with people you don't live with.

If you are experiencing symptoms or have been advised by a healthcare provider to get tested, rapid testing is available.
