<u>Literary and Academic Enhancement Programs</u>~A literary enhancement program is being initiated for incoming Kindergarten students. Homework incentive program continues for $6^{th} \& 7^{th}$ graders incorporating floor hockey or basketball during lunch. A book club continues in the High School. Year-round in and out of-classroom support, all grades, all buildings.

SIMS (Success in Middle School)~A transition program, SIMS, begins in winter and helps promote success as students move from 5th grade to Middle School: speakers, activities that provide a roadway to growth, creating their own locker organizers and time to practice combination locks are some of the weekly SIMS activities for 5th graders.

* <u>SNI Dept. of Education</u> offers JOM, educational and tutoring support all levels. Elective classes are offered at the Sr. High School. Seneca Language

programs will continue at Middle and High School level. Tutoring of students, elementary, middle and high school level.

*<u>SNI Behavioral Health Services</u> Behavioral Health counselors provide inschool weekly Lunch Bunch groups for 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students emphasizing prevention and best practices for healthy living.

*<u>SNI Seneca Language & Culture Program</u>~Works closely with Lake Shore incorporating culturally relevant activities and presentations throughout the school year, Kindergarten through 12th grade.

November, Native American Heritage Month~will see numerous activities, building-wide at all grade levels. We look for whole-school enthusiasm and participation as in years' past.

<u>Architecture in Schools</u>—The Buffalo Architecture Foundation brings their handson program to the Middle School in the spring. Native American students experience architecture first hand, as they listen to professional architects and work toward creating their own 3-dimensional architectural piece.

ACE Club~The high school's Native American culture club. The club will work on a float for the homecoming parade, and help with events for Native American Heritage Month. ACE Club also works on a few traditional crafts throughout the year. The club helps to positively promote Native American culture throughout the high school.

NEW this year to the High School! Native American Crafts Class ~A noncredit bearing class that will focus on two traditional craft methods per quarter. The class is limited to 10 HS students. To join the class students must have time available in their schedule and participate on a consistent basis.

STEP (Science Technology Entry Program)~through SUNY Fredonia will continue. STEP meets after school and will focus on creating a research project that can be presented at a conference. Over this summer, four students went on a STEP trip to Washington, D.C. where they visited the National Institute of Health, the National zoo and National aquarium. Students interested in applying to be a member of the STEP program must be enrolled in science and math, and have an 85 in both.
