

Welcome back, everybody! We are getting ready to return to school for the 2024-25 school year, and can't wait to see everyone. We've had a busy summer here at Lake Shore.

We're excited to begin operating our Universal Pre-K classrooms with Lake Shore teachers this year. Our teachers have been working on their curriculum and getting their classrooms ready for the start of classes. Our UPK classes will still be housed in the W.T. Hoag Educational Center like they were when they were contracted to the YMCA. The Boys & Girls Club of Lake Shore will be operating the District's before & after school program ("The Wrap-Around Program") beginning this year, too.

We are welcoming a number of new teachers and staff. New staff members attended an orientation session and have been assigned mentors to help them get acclimated.

The safety of our students and staff remains a primary focus of the District. Please rest assured that if our buildings are open, it is safe to send your children to school. If there is ever a threat against a school building or anybody in the building, law enforcement will be involved, and if we feel that there is a risk involved with being in the building, the school will be closed. One of the most important things you can do to

help your child learn is to get them to school every day.

Lake Shore is scheduled to take delivery of our third electric school bus this year. It will be our first electric mini bus. We also have 13 more full-sized (71-passenger) buses on order to be received sometime before next summer. These are the first part of the 20 buses that the District will purchase with the \$7.9 million Federal grant that we received through the EPA.


Thank you, JANE!

The High School Math department is on year two of the Next Generation Learning Standards roll out beginning with the new standards in Regents Geometry classes this school year. The math department also continues to offer many electives to appropriately challenge students at all levels and with varying interests. Regardless of post graduation plans, all students should take 4 years of math and there is plenty to choose from!

The High School English and Language Arts department is excited about our inaugural Honors English field trip to New York City. 32 juniors and seniors will spend an October weekend touring literary landmarks and seeing *The Outsiders*, the 2024 Tony Award winner for best musical. We plan to make this a biennial opportunity for our students.







The K-12 art department had a busy 2023-24 school year! The department participated in the Makers Faire, held art shows at their respective buildings, organized an art exhibit and community event at Suncliff on the Lake, took students on field trips to the AKG Gallery, held a senior art exhibit, and brought a group of 40 students to New York City!

This year, the department plans on collaborating with K Gallery, located in downtown Buffalo. to exhibit the work of our k-12 indigenous students. This will take place throughout the month of November. The department looks forward to participating in this new exhibition, along with our annual activities this year.





Why should high school students take as many science classes as possible...

Bottom line... taking science classes in high school will open many more doors and benefit you most regardless of career path.






Departmental News 🥖



The Middle School social studies department has been working hard on the NYS Seal for Civic Readiness. We have created a really nice program that progresses from 6th grade into 8th grade and allows our students the opportunity to gain a point toward their Seal for Civic Readiness upon entering the high school. They then have multiple opportunities to continue on this path moving toward graduation. Last school year we sent our first group of 8th graders to the high school with a point for completing a service project that helped solve a societal problem. One team did a sneaker drive and one team did a food drive. Roughly 90% of the students completed the project and earned a point.



The Physical Education staff is happy to add a Lifeguard Training elective class this year. The class will be a semester long and the students who successfully complete the course will be certified Lifeguards. This class will not replace their already scheduled physical education class.







K-5 teachers are actively engaged in professional development focused on implementing best practices for teaching reading. The K-5 Writing Curriculum is comprehensively articulated, providing numerous opportunities for students to integrate writing across various subjects. Additionally, Grades 4-5 will be introducing enVision, a new and innovative math program that is aligned with the New York State math standards.

SUMMER FUN!


