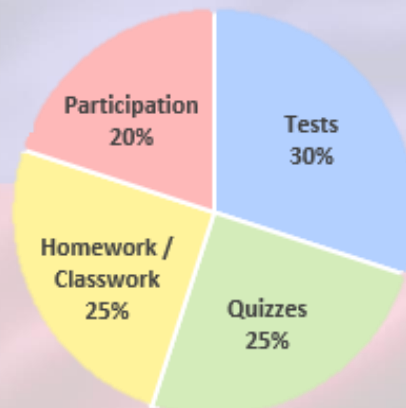
## FRENCH 1 LEARNING TARGETS:
