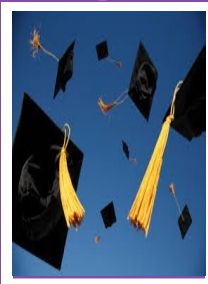
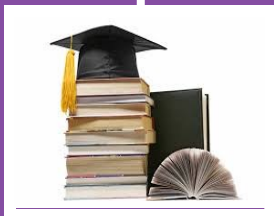
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### Congratulations Lake Shore Graduates of 2017!

Congratulations to Derise Waterman for receiving the Character Award in the Sectional final!

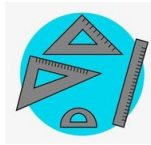


# Future Architects

The Buffalo Architecture Foundation came to Lake Shore for the 3rd consecutive year to work with Middle School students in a 2-day event. The goal is to inspire young people to consider careers in architecture. The students made towers from marshmallows and toothpicks, and transferred the skills of cross-bracing on day 2 to make a larger scale pyramid as a group.

# Success in Middle School

Each year all fifth grade Native American students at J.T. Waugh and A.J. Schmidt elementary schools participate in SIMS (Success in Middle School). SIMS is a transitional group, designed to assist students in a positive and successful transition from fifth grade onto sixth grade in the Middle School. The group is run by Nancy Klemens, Title VI Home School Liaison and Amanda Sobczyk, JOM instructor. The students learn a myriad of skills, designed to promote success in the next journey of their lives. Some of them are: practicing combination locks, gleaning advice from outstanding sixth graders, and taking part in conversations focused on everything from getting up an hour earlier to staying after school for homework help and extra-curricular activities. Finally, the students learn to hand sew; they sew a pillow for the teacher that has had the most impact on their lives, and culminate with a final project in which they create their own locker organizers to hang in their Middle School locker.
