Collaboration with The Seneca Nation



SNI Dept. of Education- offers JOM, educational and tutoring support all levels. Elective classes are offered at the Sr. High School. Seneca Language programs are offered at the Middle and High Schools.

SNI Behavioral Health Unit- BHU counselors provide in-school weekly Lunch Bunch groups for 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students emphasizing prevention and best practices for healthy living. They also offer programming opportunities at the MS and HS.

SNI Language & Culture- Works closely with Lake Shore incorporating culturally relevant K-12 activities and presentations throughout the year.

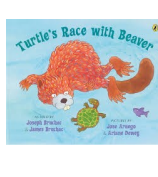
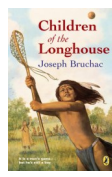
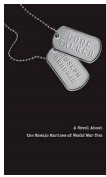
Author Visit with Joseph Bruchac
